Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences to Host 2019 Disaster Symposium

Bethesda, Md. – Important issues impacting evidence-based approaches to disaster preparedness and response will be the focus of the upcoming disaster symposium, "Disasters and Health: State of Science," April 25-26, 2019, in Washington, D.C.

The symposium, which will be held at the American Geophysical Union, 2000 Florida Avenue NW, is sponsored by the National Center for Disaster Medicine and Public Health, part of the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences.
