Lt Col Shawna Greiner is an Air Force nurse anesthetist and educator currently serving as a Professor of nurse anesthesia and content expert in Evidence Based Practice at The Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences.

Previously, Lt Col Greiner served as the Deputy Director of Academic Affairs for the US Army Graduate Program in Anesthesia Nursing. Before teaching at the Army Program, she taught at the Uniformed Services University of Health Sciences in the Graduate School of Nursing.

Lt Col Greiner has served in the Navy and Air Force for 22 years in a variety of roles including staff nurse in myriad specialties, nurse anesthetist, Chief Nurse Anesthetist, Flight Commander, educator, Curriculum Committee Chair, and has deployed to Afghanistan.

She earned a Bachelor's of Science in Nursing from the University of Florida in 1992, a Master's of Science in Nursing in Anesthesia at the University of Texas Health Science Center, Houston through the United States Army Graduate Program of Anesthesia Nursing in 2006, and Doctorate of Philosophy at Rush University in 2015.

Her awards include Company Grade Officer Nurse of the Year 2001, the Golden Lamp Society Dissertation Award in 2013, and the Luther Christman Nursing Researcher Award in 2014. During her military career, Lt Col Greiner has also been awarded one Navy, one Air Force, and two Army Achievement medals. She also has an Air Force Commendation medal, Meritorious Service medal with Oak Leaf Cluster, and a Defense Meritorious Service Medal. To date Lt Col Greiner has authored her dissertation on emergence delirium and co-authored publications focused on ethics, deployment experiences of mothers, and military mental health stigma.
