Lieutenant Colonel Douglas E. Dillon is an Assistant Professor in the Graduate School of Nursing. He received his Bachelor of Science in Nursing from the Medical University of South Carolina in 1995 and was commissioned a second lieutenant in the US Army Nurse Corp where he served as a medical-surgical nurse and psychiatric nurse until 1998 when he transitioned to the USAF. Since reentering the USAF he has had assignments as a medical-surgical nurse, psychiatric nurse, flight nurse and Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner. He received his Master of Science in Nursing from the University of Texas, Health Science Center, San Antonio, TX in 2008 and his Doctor of Nursing Practice from the University of Virginia in 2015.

Lt Col Dillon's area of clinical practice interest is the training of evidence based suicide risk assessment in the primary care setting and psychopharmacology.

Lt Col Dillon was recognized as the USAFE Mental Health Nurse of the Year for both 2009 and 2010. His military awards include the Meritorious Service Medal, Aerial Achievement Medal, USAF Commendation Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Air Force Achievement Medal, and the Army Achievement Medal.
