

Pediatric Advanced Clinical Rotations

SUBINTERNSHIPS – 4 weeks of continuous inpatient experience with night call and other responsibilities at the level of an intern. Subinternships often involve presenting a patient at morning report or other teaching venues. Graded as HONORS/PASS/FAIL/INCOMPLETE.

Pediatric Ward	PDR4632	The student will engage in the admission history and physical for inpatients, follow several patients with daily reports and notes, develop management plans, and talk with parents.
Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU)	PDR4381	The student will engage in the admission history and physical for inpatients, follow several patients with daily reports and notes, develop management plans, and talk with parents.
Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU)	PDR4631	The student will engage in the admission history and physical for inpatients, follow several patients with daily reports and notes, develop management plans, and talk with parents.
Newborn Service	PDR4038	The student will be responsible to attend deliveries when pediatric presence is requested. The student will learn neonatal delivery room resuscitation. The student will perform admission physicals on newborns born without complications, follow them daily, speak with parents, observe interaction with mother (including breast feeding) and develop discharge and follow-up plans. The student will participate in the identification and transfer of sick neonates to the NICU.

ELECTIVE ROTATIONS – Focused experience with no requirement for night or weekend call. Electives often involve presenting a patient at morning report or other teaching venues and/or writing a short paper on a pertinent issue. Graded as PASS/FAIL/INCOMPLETE.

Pediatric Ward	PDR4670	The student will engage in the admission history and physical for inpatients, follow several patients with daily reports and notes, develop management plans, and talk with parents. The student is under the supervision of residents and staff.
Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU)	PDR4380	The student will engage in the admission history and physical for inpatients, follow several patients with daily reports and notes, develop management plans, and talk with parents. The student is under the supervision of residents and staff.
Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU)	PDR4224	The student will engage in the admission history and physical for inpatients, follow several patients with daily reports and notes, develop management plans, and talk with parents. The student is under the supervision of residents and staff.
Adolescent Medicine	PDR4300	The student will perform history and physical evaluations on patients in adolescent clinic and for consults. The student will develop a differential diagnosis and an evaluation/management plan. The student will use the HEADSS format for interviews and speak with the patient about confidentiality. The student is under the supervision of residents and staff.
Ambulatory Pediatrics (Clinic)	PDR4310	The student will participate in the general pediatric clinic including the well-baby and newborn follow-up clinics. The student will perform history and physical examination; develop a differential diagnosis and an evaluation/management plan for patients. The student is under the supervision of residents and staff.

Child Advocacy (Child abuse and neglect)	PDR4238	The student will learn the format for interviewing and examining children who may have experienced abuse or neglect. The procedures for an appropriate forensic examination will be discussed. The interview of parents or others who may be involved will be discussed. Active cases will be seen with staff. There may be opportunity to review records of children previously diagnosed with child abuse or neglect.
Developmental Pediatrics	PDR4330	The student will attend the outpatient Developmental Pediatric clinic and participate in the evaluation, diagnosis, and management of children who present with attention deficit disorder, mental retardation, autism, and cerebral palsy. The student will have the opportunity to attend High Risk Newborn clinic and to participate in ward and nursery consults. The student is under the supervision of residents and staff.
Media Communication in Health Care	PDR4127	To allow post-clerkship students at USU to improve their use of media, their ability to communicate and the confidence to assist others in media use. By the end of the 4-week elective, students will complete the following 10 lessons: (1) Understanding, Influencing and Reacting to “First Impressions”; (2) Explore Media Theory; (3) Speaking Without Words – Practicing Nonverbal Clinical Communication Skills; (4) Create a Memorable Message with Impact, Using Only Your Voice as a Tool; (5) Podcasts, Radio and Telephone Skills; (6) Creating the Most Impactful Video Message; (7) Nail Your Clinical Presentations and Job Interviews – Speak with Confidence!; (8) Managing Social Media Messaging; (9) Address Stage Fright Through Rehearsal; and (10) Overcoming Challenging Presentations.
Pediatric Cardiology	PDR4430	The student will attend the outpatient pediatric cardiology clinic and participate in the evaluation, diagnosis, and management of children who present with undiagnosed heart murmurs and those children who are being seen for follow-up. The student will have the opportunity to attend echo cardiogram workups, learn to read pediatric EKGs, and participate in ward and nursery consults. The student is under the supervision of residents and staff.
Pediatric Endocrinology	PDR4450	The student will attend the outpatient Pediatric Endocrine clinic and participate in the evaluation, diagnosis, and management of children who present with short stature, diabetes, precocious puberty, obesity, and thyroid disorders. The student will have the opportunity to attend pediatric nutrition clinic and to participate in ward and nursery consults. The student is under the supervision of residents and staff.
Pediatric Gastroenterology	PDR4460	The student will attend the outpatient Pediatric Gastroenterology clinic and participate in the evaluation, diagnosis, and management of children who present with gastroesophageal reflux, diarrhea, malnutrition, inflammatory bowel disease, and constipation. The student will have the opportunity to participate in esophagoscopies, colonoscopies, and ward and nursery consults. The student is under the supervision of residents and staff.
Pediatric Genetics	PDR4470	The student will attend the outpatient Pediatric Genetics clinic and participate in the evaluation, diagnosis, and management of children who present with Down Syndrome, Turner’s Syndrome, Fragile X, Klinefelters, and unknown disorders. The student will have the opportunity to participate in genetic counseling and ward and nursery consults. The student is under the supervision of residents and staff.
Pediatric Hematology/Oncology	PDR4480	The student will attend the outpatient Pediatric Hematology/Oncology clinic and participate in the evaluation, diagnosis, and management of children who present with sickle cell anemia and other anemias, undiagnosed masses, immune disorders, follow-up and chemotherapy of oncology outpatients, and workup of febrile oncology patients.. The student will have the opportunity to participate in bone marrow aspirations, lumbar punctures, and ward and nursery consults. The student may also follow pediatric inpatients with oncology diagnoses. The student is under the supervision of residents and staff.

Pediatric Infectious Disease	PDR4490	The student will attend the outpatient Pediatric Infectious Disease clinic and participate in the evaluation, diagnosis, and management of children who present with MRSA, fever of unknown origin, septic arthritis, Lyme Disease, and unknown rash/fever. The student will have the opportunity to participate in ward and nursery consults. The student is under the supervision of residents and staff.
Pediatric Nephrology	PDR4510	The student will attend the outpatient Pediatric Nephrology clinic and participate in the evaluation, diagnosis, and management of children who present with nephritis, nephrosis, and renal failure. The student will have the opportunity to participate in renal biopsies and ward and nursery consults. The student is under the supervision of residents and staff.
Pediatric Neurology	PDR4520	The student will attend the outpatient Pediatric Neurology clinic and participate in the evaluation, diagnosis, and management of children who present with seizure disorders, possible intracranial masses, mental retardation, and hypotonia. The student will have the opportunity to participate in ward and nursery consults. The student is under the supervision of residents and staff.
Pediatric Pulmonology	PDR4610	The student will attend the outpatient Pediatric Pulmonology clinic and participate in the evaluation, diagnosis, and management of children who present with asthma, cystic fibrosis, and recurrent pneumonia. The student will have the opportunity to participate in pulmonary function testing and ward and nursery consults. The student is under the supervision of residents and staff.
Newborn Service	PDR4660	The student will be responsible to attend deliveries when pediatric presence is requested. The student will learn neonatal delivery room resuscitation. The student will perform admission physicals on newborns born without complications, follow them daily, speak with parents, observe interaction with mother (including breast feeding). The student will participate in the transfer of sick neonates to the NICU.
Pediatric Research and Independent Study	CAP4000	Contact Dr. Ottolini before beginning this rotation, thereafter coordinate with the faculty member you have chosen.
Introduction to Pediatric Residency	PDR4543	Students may participate in a mix of outpatient and inpatient experiences. The elective is flexible and can be tailored to the needs of the student and site. The site coordinator is responsible for obtaining appropriate evaluations and assigning a grade.
