Dr. Chung is an Associate Professor and Vice Chair of Radiology and Radiological Sciences at the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USUHS), and Pediatric Section Chief at the American Institute for Radiologic Pathology. She is the current President of the USUHS Faculty Senate.
