

L. Andrew Huff, Colonel, Medical Corps, U.S. Air Force



Colonel L. Andrew Huff is the Director, Armed Forces Radiobiology Research Institute (AFRRI), Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USU) in Bethesda, Maryland. He arrived at AFRRI in 2007 and became the Assistant Director for Military Medical Operations. In 2010, he was selected to fill the role of Deputy Director and in March 2012, he became the Interim Director. He was formally selected as Director in January 2013.

Colonel Huff was directly commissioned after earning a bachelor's degree in 1984. Upon graduation from USU with a medical degree in 1988, he completed a transitional internship, and then reported for duty as a squadron flight surgeon. He also served as a physician in primary care and emergency department settings. He completed his psychiatry residency in 1997 from the 59th Medical Wing Medical Center at Lackland AFB, Texas, earned a Master of Public Health degree in 2001 from Harvard University, and finished an aerospace/occupational medicine residency in 2003 from the U.S. Air Force School of Aerospace Medicine.

Prior to his current position, Colonel Huff commanded the 99th Aerospace Medicine Squadron at Nellis AFB, Nevada. He then served as the air component surgeon to the U.S. Northern Command (USNORTHCOM). He has deployed to Qatar and Colombia.
